# LETTER FROM THE RECTOR

In the coming months, we have a number of events which focus on remembering the past: heritage weekend, bonfire night, Remembrance Sunday, ending of course with Christmas, when we celebrate the unique moment when God entered human history in the person of Jesus Christ. Also this year we are celebrating the 500th anniversary of the European Reformation. This world-changing event began when Martin Luther



famously published his 95 theses (or arguments) in Wittenberg, Germany on 31st October 1517. In doing so, Luther became the catalyst for a spiritual movement that soon reached our shores. At the heart of the reformation was a conviction that we can be saved only through faith in the powerful work of God in Christ.

In fact, the seeds of that reformation began earlier in England through the work of John Wycliffe, who served as Rector just up the road in Lutterworth. His determination to return the church of his day to the Bible, rejecting the power, wealth and politics of the church, saw wonderful spiritual renewal and paved the way for Luther, Calvin, Cranmer and others a century later.

It is that tradition that we seek to follow in our own small way, here at St Mary's Cotesbach. At our village church you're assured of a warm welcome, but you'll also have the chance to experience services in both traditional and modern styles, and preaching that reminds us of truths that transcends time and yet also connects with life in 21st century Britain.

Harborough District Council regrettably recently approved both Magna Park applications, doubling its current size.
